GUIDELINES FOR PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

Public Comment period is provided at the discretion of the City Council

NOTE: The Council President has discretion to enforce these guidelines for the

orderly and civil conduct of City Council meetings

- Each speaker is allowed three minutes, unless time is extended by Council
 President
- Meeting attendees cannot "donate" their speaking time to another person unless prior permission is obtained
- Speakers are not permitted to comment on topics that come up later as
 Public Hearing item
- All remarks should be addressed to the Council as a whole
- Speakers shall refrain from comment or behavior that involves involving:
 - a. Causing a disruption with Nname-calling or personal attacks
 - b. Causing a disruption with Oobscene, indecent, or libelous remarks
 - c. Advertising or promoting a private enterprise
 - d. Promoting the sale of products or services
 - e. Promoting any contest or lottery
 - f. Promoting candidates for public office or upcoming ballot measures
- City Council reserves the right to restrict a person's opportunity to address the meeting
- A violation of these guidelines may cause a speaker to be asked to leave the meeting
