MINUTES

Presentation on Services and Support for People Experiencing Homelessness [00:03:20]

Tara Sundin and Samya Lutz, Planning and Community Development

Tara and Samya presented on the city's many strategies to address affordable housing and homelessness.

- Samya presented on the full spectrum of programs that the city supports from emergency shelter to homeownership, and the many agencies that the city partners with to address these issues.
- Samya talked about the barriers to shelter/housing for individuals.
- Tara presented on the results of the homeless strategies work group, including the current county-wide goals.
- Tara presented on the increase in capacity over the past year, including 25 tiny homes through Homes Now and another tiny home village through Road 2 Home, and an increase in winter weather beds.
- The city is focusing on families with children for future programs. Tara showed a map of all the projects underway to address homelessness and affordable housing.
- MNAC representatives had questions and comments regarding a variety of subjects including; the definition of unsheltered, inclusionary zoning, amount of money we get from federal and state funding, communications outreach, how to publicize this information, lessons learned from Camp 210, plans for extreme weather events, campers on Cornwall, comparing the amount Bellingham spends to other cities, why the unhoused population has increased, the Northwest Youth Services house, the senior population in need, if houseless people from other communities come to Bellingham, a solution for hosting houseless individuals in community members' properties, and what the legal requirement is for the city to take care of.
