Presentation on 2022 Pedestrian & Bicycle Master Plan Updates [00:05:00]

Chad Schulhauser, Public Works Assistant Director, and Andrea Reiter, Environmental Education and Outreach Specialist

- The Pedestrian and Bicycle Master Plans are city-wide plans that the city is updating from previously adopted plans in 2012 and 2014.
- There will be a focus on transparency and accessibility for the public throughout the community engagement process. There will be technical review committees, four open houses, a page on the Engage Bellingham website, community surveys, and email updates.
- MNAC members' questions and comments included: the incorporation of the Fairhaven Urban Village
 plan, timelines, neighborhood-focused meetings, having a mission statement for the whole process,
 tracking single-occupancy vehicles, pedestrian improvements, bike lanes on Illinois Street, limiting
 right-of-way inclusions, safe school routes, new developments, maintenance of rights-of-way,
 improving Cordata bike access to the rest of the city, bike lockers, and ADA improvements

Neighborhood Round Table [01:02:00]

Fairhaven

Elections occurred at previous meeting, so there are new people on the board. Have formed a subcommittee for participation in the bicycle and pedestrian master plan. The annual Fairhaven Plant and Tree sale will be held on March 26th.

• Edgemoor

Working with SSC on a pilot program for single stream recycling.

WWU

Mask mandate will be in place for the first two weeks back on campus after Spring break. Local Lobby Day will be on May 6th. Will no longer have a March or August graduation ceremony.

Happy Valley

League of Women Voters reached out to try and get students registered to vote. Working on getting input nailed down on the bike and pedestrian plans. Interested in getting a volunteer-based program through Public Works to get more involved in public spaces.

York

Elections will be held at the upcoming board meeting. Working on a hybrid meeting for the upcoming board meeting. Park work parties have been happening and they anticipate more this year. Lt. Claudia Murphy, Bellingham Police, met with the neighborhood and was very informative.

Cordata

First live board meeting in two years is coming up. Manager of Bellis Fair mall coming to the next community meeting. Getting a community garden up and running. Trying to get a branch for the library open near the neighborhood.

Sehome

Had their elections at the last meeting. Working on a land acknowledgement and trying to learn what the name "Sehome" means, as there are several different stories about it. Will be holding an Easter Egg hunt the Saturday before easter.

Cornwall

Learned about Parkview Elementary School at the last community meeting. No changes to the board.

Sunnyland

Just had their first in-person board meeting. Lt. Claudia Murphy, Bellingham Police, attended a meeting, and it was well received. Planning an Earth Day celebration for the day after earth day this April.

• Lettered Streets

Elections got pushed to April. Requests about public art and street tree planting have been coming in. Concern about a neighbor using an air horn. Concern about the new development on Holly Street and its effects on the Broadway Overlook.

Birchwood

Excitement about the West Maplewood Park. Concern about the development by the golf course. Developers need to make clearer information and maps for the public. Fundraising for the Birchwood International Festival and finding volunteers.

Colombia

Two new members are on the board. Neighborhood got to give feedback on the Lorraine Ellis playground.

South Hill

Neighborhood board has a new president, Scott Jones. Next meeting will have Greg Hope, Bellingham Fire/OEM, speaking about emergency preparedness. Concern over vegetation on sidewalks and City Ordinances about taking care of vegetation.

Samish

Looking into doing a summer picnic this year. Going to look into doing a land acknowledgement as well.
