• Fairhaven

• York

Working with Parks and Public Works on removal of the entryway to Rockhill Park along Lakeway as well as the Lakeway/Ellis area. Dumpster Day on June 18th helped manage the garbage that is usually dumped on the sidewalk during graduation time. Picnic will be on September 11th.

• City Center

Downtown Sounds is currently running on Wednesdays. Opportunity Council has been making changes to the 22 North building, neighborhood is seeing improvement. The task force meeting recordings will be available shortly.

• South

100 Acre Wood Master Plan is currently being written. There has been some conflict between restoration and use, but mostly people are in agreement about what needs to be done.

Working with the City to put artwork in the roundabout. Working with the Library about adding library services to North Bellingham. Hosted a joint meeting with the King Mountain neighborhood and Chris Comeau on the pedestrian master plan. Would like to get a safe passage for pedestrians over Meridian. Event in September will be held on September 11th. Using See Click Fix for overgrown vegetation is effective, but would like to be able to call in graffiti in the same way.

 Lt. Claudia Murphy joined to say that graffiti is a crime so it needs to be reported through Cop Logic instead of See Click Fix.

• Sehome

See Click Fix has been working for trash removal. There is now a Sehome neighbor working on the 22 North Task Force. Will be holding a neighborhood garage sale with a date TBD. Would like to use a QR code for this.

• Sunnyland

Sunnyland hosted a neighborhood-wide yard sale in June and it went really well and utilized a QR code map. The Sunnyland Stomp went well. Neighbors have been brainstorming logos and slogans. Neighborhood Picnic will be on August 2nd for National Night Out.

• Lettered Streets

Ice Cream Social will be on Tuesday, August 9th. Planning to do some scattered listening sessions in the neighborhood with board members. Talking about hosting candidate conversations.

• South Hill
