SUBJECT:	CORNWALL BEACH PARK NAME & FINAL DESIGN APPROVAL
DATE:	AUGUST 29, 2022

Staff will present a final design overview, including incorporation of park design standard benches, light poles, and signage. Staff is also requesting a name recommendation from the Board in accordance with city policy PAR 1.00.01.

The 17-acre site commonly referred to as "Cornwall Beach Park" was master planned in 2014. Phase 1 engineering and permitting is underway, which includes design and installation of a new entrance sign featuring the new park name.

Phase 1 work is focused on underground utilities, parking, beach creation, trails, and other park amenities. Work has been coordinated with two overlapping cleanup actions: Cornwall Landfill and RG Haley cleanup sites.

Staff solicited names from the public in accordance with City Policy PAR 1.00.01. The public process was launched on social media and through the City's Engage Bellingham website. Projects published on the Engage Bellingham are sent to local media, interested parties, neighborhood associations, boards, commissions, and others. Names were solicited from March 7 through April 29, 2022. Staff also reached out to the Nooksack and Lummi Nations in May of 2022.

All name suggestions are included in the attached Engage Bellingham project report. Over 5,000 individuals visited the project webpage, and over 500 idea submissions were received.

The top 10 name suggestions are as follows:

- 1. Lhaq'temish or Lhaq'temish Park (Lummi Park)
- 2. Glass Beach Park or Glass Beach or Glass Beach Preserve
- 3. Slug Beach or Slug Zone Beach
- 4. X'wótqwem (Whatcom) Beach
- 5. Sea Glass Beach
- 6. Tokitae Park or Tokitae Memorial Park
- 7. Discount Gas/Milk Beach
- 8. Cornwall Cove

- 9. Sea Glass Cove
- 10. Salish Sea Heritage Park

The top 10 list excludes the name suggestion "Beachy McBeach Face" and similar variations of that name. The number 1 name idea is for local tribal nations to name the park.

This is the second time staff have solicited names for this park. In 2014, when the park master plan was finalized, staff solicited names over a period of several months at public meetings, in the Parks Administration Office, via email, and an online survey. Over 300 name suggestions were submitted at that time. The previous list of names was discussed and considered at the March 2014 Park Board meeting. During the following meeting in April 2014, board members agreed to carefully study the list of names and continue their outreach to members of the public, including the Lummi Nation. At the May 2014 Park Board meeting, members narrowed the list to the 5 top names: Bayside Park, Island View Park, Klipsun Park, Salish Sea Park, Waterfront Park, and Wharf Park.

Later in 2014, The Bellingham Parks and Recreation Advisory Board recommended that City Council adopt the name "Klipsun Park" as the official name. The word "Klipsun" may be derived from the Lummi language and may be translated to mean "beautiful sunset." Board members felt that this name acknowledged the cultural significance of the park and the natural beauty to behold there. However, the 2014 naming process did not move forward after this recommendation and the name was not accepted city.

1. Parking Naming Policy

Naming of Parks, Recreation Areas and Facilities

Reference Number PAR 01.00.01

Purpose

To establish requirements for naming or renaming of parks and recreational facilities.

Scope

This policy applies to all park facilities.

Definitions

City - City of Bellingham Parks and Recreation Department

Park Board - is the City of Bellingham Parks and Recreation Advisory Board

Park, Facility or Park Facility - includes all City of Bellingham Parks and Recreation Department managed buildings, shelters, gazebos, amphitheater, open space areas, trails, game fields, stadiums, courts, land or other areas.

Park Name - is the name of a park facility used in print, signs, Bellingham Municipal Code, electronic media, and any other official document of the City of Bellingham.

Policy/Conditions

1. City sets rules for park names

Parks shall not be named after a living person.

Duplication of park names shall be avoided.

Parks shall not be named after a deceased person or significant event unless there has been a lapse of at least ten years after the event occurred or person's deceased date.

Renaming of Parks shall follow the same process set forth in this policy.

2. Park Director or designee facilitates the public process for naming all parks

Park Director or designee solicits names from the general public by issuing a press release, posting a public sign at the Facility, or conducting a public meeting. City staff may also provide suggestions for park name.

Park Director or designee records all names and forwards to the Park Board for final recommendation.

3. Park Board recommends park name

Park Board considers all name suggestions received up to the time of voting. Park Board may also provide suggestions.

Park Board votes on the names. The name selected by majority is forwarded to City Council for final action.

4. City Council approves park name

City Council reviews recommendation by Park Board and approves the final park name.

5. City allows variation of park names

Approved park names may be abbreviated or varied if approved by the Park Director or designee.

Examples:

Little Squalicum Park: Little Squalicum, LSP, Little Squalicum Beach

Boulevard: Boulevard Park, Boulevard, Boulevard Park Upper, Boulevard Park Lower

6. City provides exceptions to this policy

Exceptions to this policy may include:

- Naming a facility after a living person, recently deceased person, or important event if that person has provided a significant donation or service to the city
- Naming a facility as a condition of accepting a donation
- Temporary names may be used for referencing a facility until a permanent name is selected and approved per this
 policy



The development plan includes a layout of all the conceptual master planned elements.


This plan will be developed in multiple phases over several years.
