a. Park Board Subcommittee Workgroups:

Subcommittees consist of four members (or less) and are to be self-supported. Board members that showed interest in subcommittees were recorded and the groups will be defined at a later meeting.

b. Climate Resiliency:

Seth Vidana, the City's Climate Energy Manager, presented the City of Bellingham's current climate action plan. The main topic of discussion was regarding the two types of climates projects: carbon emissions reduction projects and climate resiliency projects.

c. Future Topics Related to Recreation:

Melissa Bianconi provided a brief overview of the initial plan at Civic, updates at Arne Hanna, and shared that Civic's Phase 2 project presentation should be ready within the next few months, which will then be brought to Park Board. She informed the group that there will now be "drop-in" badminton nights at Bloedel Donovan and if there is a high attendance rate then that could turn into a possible badminton league in the near future.
