sanitize. The mirrors are rusting and becoming loose from their wall attachments which are a safety hazard. Privacy partitions have outlived their useful life. The waterslide needs a safety evaluation and standard maintenance, including recoating the exterior glaze to help protect it from weather elements and improve functionality and outward appearance.

3) Expected Outcomes

Clean and safe facilities meeting regulatory aquatic facility standards.

4) Other implications of requested change

It is critical to maintain our aquatic facility to high levels of cleanliness, sanitation, and safety. The facility is routinely inspected by the department of health. Additionally, it will reduce public complaints about perceived unsanitary conditions in the Arne Hanna locker rooms.

1) Request Description

Replace wood perimeter fence and antiquated irrigation system that supports a variety of rare trees, shrubs, and plants in the sculpture garden.

2) Justification: How does this modification fit within existing workplans and the priorities?

The wood perimeter fence is the original fence built by George Drake. Both the fence and irrigation system are at the end of life. The irrigation lines and heads and standpipes are requiring additional water and yearly repairs. The fence needs to be replaced with a more secure fence.

3) Expected Outcomes

The Sculpture Garden will be protected from vandalism and the vegetation will be preserved. Ultimately, we expect to use less irrigation water by using more efficient drip irrigation.

4) Other implications of requested change

This is a popular park in the Silver Beach neighborhood. We do have a dedicated group of park stewards that help to maintain the vegetation and sculptures.
